RESOLUTION OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

No. 189

WHEREAS it is the opinion of the Council that emergencies may arise which will involve the expenditure of Tribal funds, and for which no other Tribal funds have heretofore been made available; and

WHEREAS it is necessary that travel expenses of Council members be paid to them when attending meetings at which no quorum is present; and

WHEREAS the above exigencies were not included in the Tribal budget for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1943; therefor

BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that we appropriate, and there is hereby appropriated from the fund, "I.I.M. Acct. P-3, Papago General Fund", the sum of \$500.00, (Five Hundred Dollars), which is to be transferred to an account identified as "I.I.M. Acct. P-99, Papago Council Emergency Fund" for use during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1943 for expenses coming within the above described categories; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that as the annual budget for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1943 has not as yet been submitted to the Secretary of the Interior for approval, that this budget be amended by including the above mentioned appropriation as a separate item in the budget prior to submission of the budget to the Secretary of the Interior for approval.

The foregoing Resolution was on January 16, 1943, duly enacted by a vote of 14 for, and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3(a), Article V, of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Sells Agency, subject to its rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V, of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe.
