

RESOLUTION OF  
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

No. 195

RESOLVED by the Papago Council that we hereby confirm the right of the War Department of the United States of America to the use of those sites deemed suitable for the establishment of practice bombing sites on tribal lands of the Gila Bend, Sells, and San Xavier Reservations; and

RESOLVED that these sections shall, if possible, be fenced in so that the stock of the Indians on the reservations shall be protected; and

PROVIDED FURTHER that all arrangements shall be made by the Superintendent of the Sells Agency, including the determination and acceptance of a satisfactory annual rental fee, in order that all may be done to give the utmost cooperation of the Papago Tribe to the United States.

The foregoing resolution was on March 6, 1943, duly enacted by a vote of 12 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3(d), Article V, of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16, of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Sells Agency, subject to its rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe.
