

RESOLUTION
OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 303

WHEREAS, The State of Arizona, and more specifically, the county of Pima has advertized for sale for taxes, among others, the group of patented mining claims in Section 35, Township 15 South, Range 2 East, G & S R M, consisting of a total of 41.10 acres in the Quijota Mining District, known as No. 1 & 2 mining claims, claimed by W.R. Logan et al, otherwise known as Logan City Townsite or Quijota; and

WHEREAS, The existence of these unrestricted mining claims, patented in the 1880's create livestock and social problems detrimental to the welfare of the Papago people; and on these mining claims exist one dug well and one drilled well without improvements. The two above mentioned wells could be improved to give water for use in the surrounding range;

NOW THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the Papago Council that we hereby authorize the Superintendent of Sells Agency to place a bid with the Pima County Board of Supervisors of the purchase of the 41.10 acres of land in mining claims No. 1 & 2 of the Quijota Mining District at not more than \$5.00 per acre, said purchase to be paid from the General Fund, IIM Account No. PT-1.

PROVIDED, That the Papago Tribe obtain all mineral and surface rights to these lands without restriction;

PROVIDED FURTHER, That the use and sipoosition of said lands will be dtermined by the Papago Council.

The foregoing resolution was on October 18, 1946, duly enacted by a vote of 12 for o against (12 members present making a quorum) by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (a) (h), Article V, of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuatn to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984).. Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Sells Indian Agency, subject to its rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe.
