RESOLUTION
OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

NO. 312

WHEREAS; It has been found that Section XIII of Ordinance #12 of The Papago Council, dated April 8, 1944 is unfair in setting a straight fine of \$300.00 for any kind of violation of this ordinance, and

WHEREAS, It is felt that the penalties for violation should be graduated according to the seriousness of the offense,

THEREFORE, Be it resolved by The Papago Council that Ordinance #12 be amended inserting in Section XIII after the words "punishable by a fine of" the words "not more than" so that the phrase shall read "punishable by a fine of not more than \$300.00."

The foregoing resolution was on February 7, 1947, duly enacted by a vote of 12 for and 5 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 2 (m), Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Sells Agency, and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
