

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

WHEREAS, Raymond Moriste and Pete Siqueros, members of the Papago Tribe, have made application for a permit to operate a slaughter house and retail meat market at Sells, and

WHEREAS, The Papago Council believes that the establishment of these enterprises would be of benefit to the Papago people,

THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Papago Council that a permit be granted to Raymond Moriste and Pete Siqueros to operate a slaughter house and retail meat market at Sells,

PROVIDED, That such permit shall be valid only until a revised Ordinance Regulating Trader is approved by the Papago Council, unless sooner revoked, and

PROVIDED FURTHER, that all cattle slaughtered by Raymond Moriste and Pete Siqueros shall be inspected, and permitted by the Reservation cattle inspectors prior to slaughter in the same manner as if the cattle had been purchased by an outside cattle buyer, and

PROVIDED FURTHER, that all slaughtering under this permit be done at the slaughter house; that the meat obtained be kept under sanitary refrigeration; that said slaughter house and refrigeration equipment be inspected for sanitation by a qualified person designated by the Superintendent of Sells Agency; and that if improper conditions are found, such conditions shall be corrected immediately, or this permit shall become void, and

PROVIDED FURTHER, That the operation of this enterprise at Sells be approved by the Sells District Council, and an assignment of land for the use of the enterprise be made by them, or this permit shall be void, and

PROVIDED FINALLY, That any major violation of the Papago Law & Order Code by either of the permittees shall result in the automatic revocation of this permit.

The foregoing resolution was on March 31, 1947, duly enacted by a vote of 13 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3, (a) Article V and Section 5, (a), Article VIII of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 8, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 964). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval of the Superintendent of Sells Agency, subject to its rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
