
WHEREAS, it is resolved by the Papago Council that Thomas A. Segundo, Chairman; Mark Garcia, Judge; Louis Harvey, Juan Jose, Associate Judges; and Joseph J. Vazquez, Chief of Police, be authorized to attend the Indian Service Law and Order School at Santa Fe, New Mexico, to be paid \$6.00 per diem while traveling and \$5.00 per diem while at Santa Fe, payable from IHS account PI-7.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Treasurer be authorized to advance the sum of \$6.00 to each of the above mentioned delegates for expenses,

provided, that an adjustment be made at the end of the trip so that the final amount paid each delegate will be the actual amount due under the above authorized per diem estimate.


The foregoing resolution was on August 1, 1947, duly enacted by the Papago Council by a vote of 13 for and 0 against, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a), Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 18, 1932, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 5, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 10, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Saline Agency, subject to its ratification by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
