RESOLUTION
OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

EO. 225

WHEREAS, The Judge and the two Associate Judges of the Papago Tribal Court are disqualified from hearing the case of the Baboquivari District Council vs. Joe M. Valiabo et al, and

WHEREAS, There are no other appointed judges who can serve in their place, and

WHEREAS, Both parties to the case have agreed that Thomas A. Segundo will be satisfactory to them as judge,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the Papago Council that we recommend to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs that said Thomas A. Segundo be appointed Associate Judge of the Papago Tribal Court to hear this case only,

PROVIDED, That the Associate Judge be paid at a rate of \$8.00 per diem, costs to be paid by the losing party.

The foregoing Resolution was on September 5, 1947, duly enacted by a vote of 14 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (f) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Sells Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
