

RESOLUTION  
OF  
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 328

WHEREAS, It has come to the attention of the Papago Council that the office of Indian Affairs proposes to assign Dr. Bernard W. Rosenburgh to the Agency, and

WHEREAS, The Papago Council is greatly concerned with our reservation health problem, and

WHEREAS, The Papago Council feels that the members of the Papago Tribe do not have confidence in Dr. Rosenburgh from previous experience and that because of this his assignment here would be detrimental to our health program.

THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the Papago Council that a telegram be sent to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs protesting the assignment of Dr. Bernard W. Rosenburgh to this agency, and

BELT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Chairman of the Papago Council be instructed to write to the Commissioner specifying our reasons for objecting to this assignment.

The foregoing Resolution was on September 5, 1947, duly enacted by a vote of 14 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (f) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Sells Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
