RESOLUTION  
OF  
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

No. 329

WHEREAS, the Papago Council did in Resolution No. 319 set up the position of Caretaker-Jailer, but did not include therein all that was intended.

BE IT THEREFORE, Be it resolved by The Papago Council that Resolution No. 319 be amended by the addition to paragraph five, after the words "Law and Order" of the wording "in the Village of Sells only, and after 5:00 p.m. only," and by the insertion between paragraphs five and six of the following paragraph:

"PROVIDED FURTHER, That the Caretaker-Jailer be authorized to work overtime two (2) hours on Saturday and two (2) hours on Sunday when there are prisoners to be fed, such overtime to be paid at the rate of .66 per hour from the fund Papago Tribe, Court Funds - PP-8."

The foregoing Resolution was on August 1, 1947, duly enacted by a vote of 16 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a) and (b), of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Sells Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, Pursuant to Section 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
