

RESOLUTION  
OF  
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 330

WHEREAS; T. W. Robinette has made application to the Papago Council for a Tribal Business License to peddle on the Papago Reservations, as required by Ordinance No. 15, and

WHEREAS; His peddling has in the past been of benefit to the Papago people.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that we authorize the issuance of a Tribal Business License to said T. W. Robinette to peddle fruits in season and staple groceries in all villages of the Papago reservations during the Fiscal Year 1948.

PROVIDED, That said T. W. Robinette hereafter carry an approved balance scale, and

PROVIDED FURTHER, That this license be revoked immediately should said T. W. Robinette attempt to sell inferior merchandise on the Papago reservations.

The foregoing resolution was on September 19, 1947 duly enacted by a vote of 14 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (e), of Article V of the Constitution if the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Sells Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
