

-RESOLUTION-
OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 331

WHEREAS, The Arizona State Fair is to be held in Phoenix, Arizona from November 7 to November 16, 1947, and

WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe has been invited to participate in the Arts and Crafts exhibits, and

WHEREAS, The Papago Council believes it is greatly to the benefit of the Papago Tribe to do so.

THEREFORE, Be It Resolved that the Manager of the Arts and Crafts Board be authorized to travel to Phoenix, Arizona to handle, display, and sell arts and Crafts.

PROVIDED, That the Manager be paid per diem at the rate of \$6.00 per day, from the fund Papago Tribe, Miscellaneous Fund, PT-7.

The foregoing resolution was on September 19, 1947 duly enacted by a vote of 14 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 2 (1), and Section 3 (a), of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Sells Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, Pursuant to Section 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
