

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 349

WHEREAS, February 10th to 15th have been set for the 1948 Pima County Fair, and

WHEREAS, It is of benefit to the Papago Tribe that we be represented at the Pima County Fair, as in prior years,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That Mrs. Ida N. Wilson, Acting Manager of the Papago Arts and Crafts Board, be authorized to attend the 1948 Pima County Fair as representative of the Papago Tribe to supervise the Tribal exhibit, manage the Papago demonstration, and the sales of Papago handicrafts,

PROVIDED, That Mrs. Ida N. Wilson, receive \$8.00 per diem in lieu of expenses for the time spent in Tucson, Arizona, in this connection, such monies to be paid from IIM Account PT-7.

The foregoing resolution was on February 6, 1948, duly enacted by a vote of 14 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 2 (1), and Section 3 (a), of Article V, of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Sells Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V, of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
