

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 353

WHEREAS, During the recent Dourine Eradication Program many reservation corrals and other stock handling equipment necessarily received extra heavy usage and are now in poor repair, and

WHEREAS, There remains in I.I.M. Account No. PT-16 a balance of \$1,597.89 originally made available for dourine eradication, and now planned for completion of commitments made as to corral and loading chute facilities,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the balance now in I.I.M. Account No. PT-16 entitled, Papago Tribe, Rehabilitation Trust Fund, F.Y. 1941, be expended for repairs to corrals and other reservation livestock handling facilities damaged in the dourine eradication program. Such expenditures to include the purchase of materials, supplies and payment of labor as may be deemed necessary.

The foregoing resolution was on February 20, 1948, duly enacted by a vote of 14 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, Pursuant to Section 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
