RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe did, under Resolution No. 384 purchase from Pima County at tax sale certain patented mining lands on the Papago Reservation, and

WHEREAS. The tax assessment on these lands for the Calender Year 1947 have not been paid, and

WHEREAS, This item was not included in our 1947 budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY the Papago Council that the 1947 taxes be paid in full from the Miscellaneous Fund, PT-7 to the Pima County Treasurer.

The foregoing resolution was on February 20, 1948, duly enacted by a vote of 14 for and O against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a), of Article V, of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 STat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V, of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
