RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 358

WHEREAS, Resolution of the Papago Council No. 347 appointed a delegation to go to Washington and represent the Papago Tribe in discussions with the Indian Office, Arizona Congressional Delegation, and the Congressional Committees on Indian Affairs, and

WHEREAS, The Papago Delegation has now returned and report that they were cordially received. Real hospitality was extended. There appeared to be a real interest in the problems of the Papago people and officials and others were particularly helpful in making the journey pleasant and the assignment successful.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that the Council Chairman be authorized on behalf of the Papago Tribe to prepare and submit letters conveying the gratitude and appreciation of the Tribe for the many courtesies extended to the delegation.

The foregoing resolution was on March 12, 1948, duly enacted by a vote of 17 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 2 (a), of Article V, of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Actoof June18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Papago Agency, and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
