

RESOLUTION
OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

No. 485

WHEREAS, The Papago Council purchased and received in February of 1948 a pickup truck for the use of the Tribal office, and

WHEREAS, The Papago Council now feels that it would be more economical to trade in the old pickup for a new one,


THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED By the Papago Council that the Chairman of the Papago Council be authorized to negotiate with the local dealers and place an order for a new pickup, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the proceeds from the trade-in be applied as payment for the new pickup.

The foregoing resolution was on July 8, 1948, duly adopted by a vote of 15 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Sec. 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 18, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Sec. 13 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Sec. 6, Article V, of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.


