RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

NO	. 439	

HIEREAS, The Papago Council is greatly concerned over the present lack of adequate law and order on the Papago reservations, and

WHEREAS, The requests of the Papago Council for more law and order assistance from the Papago Agency have not been granted because of the lack of funds and personnel, and

THEREAS, The Papago Council now feels it must assume the responsibility of alleviating the present situation by whatever means that may be at hand, and

WHEREAS, It is felt that the purchase of a police-wagon will partially solve the transportation problem and facilitate to a great extent the transporting of violators of the law,

THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Papago Council that the Chairman be authorized to place an order for a new police-wagon with such dealer as may best meet the needs and requirements of the Papago Council,

FROVIDED, That the payment for such police-wagon be made from FT-1, General Fund, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Chairman of the Papago Council is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with the Superintendent of the Papago Agency covering the use of the police-wagon by the Indian Service police.

The foregoing resolution was on November 18, 1949, duly enacted by a vote of 14 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Sec. 3 (a), of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the fribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Sec. 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Sec. 6, Article V, of the Constitution and Ey-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
