

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

NO. 440

MMEREAS, The Papago Council feels that it is educational and helpful to the members of the Tribe to visit fairs and exhibitions of Arts and Crafts, and

WHEREAS, The Arizona State Fair is now in progress and will continue until Sunday November 13, 1949, and

WHEREAS, Arrangements have been made for the use of a school bus to transport some of the people who are vitally interested in Arts and Crafts to the State Fair in Phoenix on Sunday November 6, 1949, and

WHEREAS, It is the set policy of the Department of Education of the Papago Agency that only the regular school bus drivers be permitted to drive the Indian Service school buses on weekends and holidays and the services of Joe Adams have been obtained,

THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Papago Council that Joe Admas be paid \$19.50 for nineteen and one-half hours (19) driving time at the rate of one dollar (\$1.00) per hour from FT-7, Eiscellaneous Fund, and

BE IT-FURTHER RESULVED, That Joe Adams be refunded the sum of four dollars and six cents (84.06) for money sp ent on gas and oil on the trip,

PROVIDED, That said refund be made from PT-7, Miscellaneous Fund.

The foregoing resolution was on November 13, 1949, duly enacted by a vote of 14 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Sec. 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1957, pursuant to Sec. 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (43 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Sec. 6, Article V, of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
