## HEROLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res. No. 676

WHEREFOR: There has been an increase in mining activities on the Papago recorvations which is of much concern to The Papago Council; and

WHEREAC: It is the understanding of The Papago Council that legislation will be introduced to amend the United States Mining laws as they apply to The Papago Reservations; and

WHERMAS: It is necessary that The Papago Council put everything pertaining to mining activities on the Papago reservations in order and the investigate the possibilities for developing the tribally owned during claims.

THERE IT HE IT ANDLYED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL: That Jose A. Ramon, Juan Larray, Fourell Hammel, Jose Haria Hendricks and Juan Jose be and are hereby appointed to the Mines Committee of the Papago Council,

PROVIDED: That the members of the Mines Committee of The Papago Council shall serve in accordance with the provisions of Resolution No. 33% of The Papago Council; and

PMOVING A MARIER: That the members of the Mines Committee shall serve independently at the pleasure of the Papago Council but failure to autenorthree (3) consecutive meetings without cause shall be desired sufficient grounds for removal; and

PROVIET BENELLY: East the expenses of the Mines Committee shall be paid from Account PT-5, Fapago Tribe, Travel Expenses, Papago Council Cormittees and Officers.

The forereing resolution was on March 6, 1953 duly enacted by the Papago Council by a vote of 18 for and 0 against pursuant to authority vested in it by Dec. 2 (e), Sec. 3 (a), (h) of Article V of the Constitution of the Iribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1775, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, persuant to Dec. 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). The resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the development of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the resolution by the Decretary of the Interior pursuant to Dec. 6, of Article V, of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
