

RESOLUTION  
OF  
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res. No. 22

WHEREAS: Section 1b of Article I of the Papago Constitution and By-Laws requires that the books and records of the Tribal Treasurer be audited once a year; and

WHEREAS: Such an audit has not been made since 1945;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL: That the Acting Chairman is hereby authorized to secure the services of a competent auditor to make this required audit of the Treasurer's books and other related data pertaining to Papago tribal business affairs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the sum of \$6.00 per day be paid for the services of this auditor for a period not to exceed 20 days and that such expenses shall be paid from IT-7, Papago Tribe, Miscellaneous Fund.

The foregoing resolution was on July 10, 1953, duly enacted by a vote of 15 for and 0 against by the Papago Council pursuant to authority vested in it by Sec. 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Sec. 16 of the Act of June 14, 1934 (48 Stat. 944). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Sec. 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
