

RESOLUTION  
OF THE  
PAPAGO COUNCIL

WHEREAS, The Chairman of the Papago Tribal Council has informed the Council that during the calendar years 1956 and 1957 he was unable to take 14 days of the annual leave due him because he had to stay on the job to take care of Tribal business, and he has been able to take only 2 days so far in the calendar year 1958 for the same reason, and

WHEREAS, the Chairman has asked the Council to authorize a special payment to him for the 14 days annual leave due him in 1956-7 only, and

WHEREAS, The Council feels that the Chairman puts in long hours in the faithful performance of his duties as Tribal Chairman, and that his request is a reasonable one.

THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that in this specific case only Resolution 615 Section II B be amended to authorize a payment to the Tribal Chairman of \$178.00, the amount of salary represented by 14 days of annual leave which he was unable to take in 1956-7.

The foregoing resolution was on July 18, 1958 duly enacted by a vote of 18 for and 0 against by the Papago Council, at a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984).
