

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1006

WHEREAS, the old fort on the Gila Bend Reservation is of considerable historical interest and importance, but is likely to be damaged if it is not protected, and

WHEREAS, The National Park Service has offered to post the signs needed to protect the fort from vandals;

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that permission be granted to the National Park Service to post signs to protect the old fort and to take whatever other steps it may consider necessary to preserve this historical landmark.

The foregoing resolution was on July 13, 1958, duly enacted by a vote of 18 for and 0 against by the Papago Council, at a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 2 (1) Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 10, 1934 (48 Stat. 984) Said resolution is effective as of the date of its enactment.
