

RESOLUTION  
OF THE  
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1018

WHEREAS, Papago Tribal Council Resolution No. 1009 was duly passed August 1, 1958 by a vote of 22 for and 0 against, and

WHEREAS, All 22 members of the Council were present at the August 1, 1958 meeting and all voted for Resolution No. 1009, and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 1009 requests the removal of Randolph Aros, Agency Special Officer, from the Papago Reservation, and

WHEREAS, Article V, Section 3 (f) of the Papago Tribal Constitution permits the Tribal Council to make such a recommendation to the Secretary of the Interior, and

WHEREAS, The Superintendent of the Papago Indian Agency disapproved Papago Tribal Council Resolution No. 1009 on August 7, 1958; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That Papago Tribal Council Resolution No. 1009, requesting the removal of Randolph Aros, Agency Special Officer, from the Papago Agency, be forwarded along with other pertinent material supporting the request for removal, to the Secretary of the Interior with the urgent request that he carry out the wishes of the Council by removing Mr. Aros from the Papago Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on September 5, 1958, duly enacted by a vote of 20 for and 0 against by the Papago Council during a meeting at which a quorum was present pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (f) of Article V of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its enactment.
