

RESOLUTION  
OF THE  
PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res. No. 1025

WHEREAS, The Papago Tribal Council passed Resolution No. 1002 on July 18, 1958, requesting an Economic Survey of the Reservation, and

WHEREAS, Senator Barry Goldwater introduced Senate Joint Resolution No. 182 in Congress on June 25, 1958, and Congressman Stewart Udall has expressed willingness to co-sponsor it in his letter to the Tribe of August 4, 1958, and

WHEREAS, Congress should be urged to take action on this Resolution at its forthcoming session.

THHEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the Chairman be directed to send letters to the Arizona Congressional delegation urging that favorable action be taken on it as soon as possible after Congress meets in January.

The foregoing resolution was on December 5, 1958, duly enacted by a vote of 22 for and 0 against by the Papago Council, at a meeting at which a quorum was present pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 2 (d) and (h) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the of its enactment.
