RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO CCUNCIL

Res.	No.	1028

WIEREAS, shortages have been discovered in the accounts kept by the Treasurer of the Papago Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, realizing that a complete audit of the books of the Papago Tribe must be made to determine the amount of these shortages, and

WHEREAS, the By-Laws of the Papago Tribe, Article 1, Section 4 (b) reads as follows: "The books and records of the Treasurer shall be audited at least once a year by a competent auditor employed by the Papago Council, and at such other times as the Council or the Commissioner of Indian Affairs may direct," and

WEREAS, this section of the By-Laws has not been followed for a number of years, and that the Tribe is in a poor financial condition at the present time;

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that such audits be conducted by the Bureau of Indian Affairs until the Tribe can afford to pay for these audits from its own funds,

AND HE IT FURTHER RESCLVED that the Council go on record as instructing the Chairman of the Papago Council to be responsible for the making of these yearly audits.

The foregoing resolution was on December 19, 1958, duly enacted by a vote of 21 for and 0 against by the Papago Council, at a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 2 (1) Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its enactment.
