

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1997 1100

WHEREAS, On March 4, 1960, the Papago Tribal Council approved a permit for the U. S. Army Electronic Proving Ground at Ft. Huachuca to inspect 9 sites on the Reservation for possible locations of small installations to track drone planes flying between Ft. Huachuca and Yuma, which will be across the Reservation, for which a payment of \$200 will be made, and

WHEREAS, On March 30, a letter was received from the U. S. Army Electronic Proving Ground applying for permission to inspect 4 additional sites, as shown on the map accompanying their letter of application, and

WHEREAS, The Council understands such permission is given for the inspection of sites only and does not give the U.S.A.E.P.G. any rights to lease; and if the U.S.A.E.P.G. applies for leases on any of the sites it will first have to secure the approval of the District Council in which the site is located, and then of the Tribal Council, and it also understands that conditions governing entry will be the same as on the agreement dated March 24, 1960, and

WHEREAS, The Council feels a fee of \$50.00 should be charged for this permit.

THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that the application of the U.S.A.E.P.G. for permission to inspect the 4 sites be approved as outlined above, and that it authorize the Chairman to sign the permit.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on April 1, 1960, with a vote of 17 for, 0 against and 4 not voting during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
