## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1099

WHEREAS, At a meeting of the Sif Oidak District Council held March 2, 1960, the District Council unanimously approved a Right of Way for El Paso Natural Gas Company for a cathodic protection station as described in their letter of application of March 2, 1959, addressed to the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Papago Agency, to which was attached a map showing the nature and location of the installation, and

WHEREAS; El Paso Natural Gas Company sent the Tribal Council a letter on March 7, 1960 agreeing to pay \$200 for the Right of Way which will expire June 12, 1977, the same time as the Right of Way on the main pipe line expires.

THEREFORE, LET IT HE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that the application of El Paso Natural Gas Company for the above Right of Way is approved, providing it is paid \$200 for the Right of Way, and that the Superintendent of the Papago Agency may grant the Right of Way in accordance with applicable government regulations.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on April 1, 1960, with a vote of 21 for and 0 against during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 2 (c) & Section 3'(h) of the Constituion of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 16, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
