## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

WHEREAS, The following budgets have been submitted to the Papago Tribal Council for their consideration, to cover the fiscal year 1961, covering the operation of 1. Tribal Office and Council, 2. Livestock Inspector's Office, 3. The Tribal Court, 4. Rodeo Board, as follows:

## 1. TRIBAL OFFICE AND COUNCIL

Salaries of Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer-Livestock Clerk (1/2), Administrative Assistant, \$1,000 provision for extra help and possible salary increases, plus estimated employer's share of F.I.C.A., and \$1,000 for expenses of Administrative Assistant.

MEREAS, The Council believes the budget has been carefully prepared and represents a reasonably accurate estimate of expenses it considers essential to the proper operation of Tribal government and believes the income has been conservatively estimated, and also approves of the deficit of \$19,775.00 authorizing the use of Tribal money now on deposit in the Treasury to make up the deficit, and

WHENEAS, The Council also understands that if income does not live up to expectations, authorized budget expenditures will be reduced or eliminated wherever possible;

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that the Pressurer be authorized to sign purchase orders and vouchors in the amounts provided in the above budgets against the properly designated accounts, and

LET IT FURTHER BE RESOLVED that inacumen as approximately \$10,000 of the anticipated income will be sent to the Treasury and will have to be released to the Tribe by the Treasury, and inacumen as expenses may exceed income by \$19,775.00, that the Council request the Superintendent to withdraw the sum of up to \$25,000 of available Tribal funds in the Treasury, as needed, to be placed in the Agency IIH account of the Tribal Council, PT-1A, in order to maintain a satisfactory working balance.

The foregoing Resolution was approved on June 3, 1960, duly enacted by a vote of 17 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council during a meeting at which a querum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Intorior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of

the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
