EJSCLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

THEMEAS, By Resolution 1123, approved by the PAPAGO THIBAL COUNCIL on July 8, 1960, the COUNCIL approved the employment of John H. Denton, of 215 North Court Street, Tucson, Arisons, as its attorney for the fiscal year, 1961, and

WHIMIAS, The Superintendent of the Papage Agency, Harry W. Cilmore, returned the caid Recolution on July 15, 1960; together with a letter stating he believed that the COUNCIL would want to enact a new Resolution to most Government requirements which he specified in his letter; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Article 5, Section 2 (b), of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe, the said Tribe acting through its COUNIL, has the authority to employ legal counsel, the choice of counsel and the fliding of feet to be subject to the approval of the Secretary of the Interior, and

MERGAS, The Pepago Tribel Council and the Chairman have frequent need to consult an attorney to obtain local guidance in the transaction of various business affairs, and they are also in need of local assistance in assorting and protecting the legal rights of the Papago Tribe, and decreases

WHEREAS; In its budget Recolution 1116, passed by the Council on June 3, 1960, which was approved by the Area Director on July 11, 1960, the Tribal Council appropriated 62,000 for the 1961 fiscal year to pay a Tribal attermay on a time and expense basis and this budget appropriation is avilable to be used for this purpose, and

MERIAS, John H. Donton, is familiar with the affairs of the Tribe and has provided consultation services to the Tribal Chairman and the Tribal Council without: fee for a number of years, and

UMERICAS, The said John H. Demon is a skilled and able atterney, having first been admitted to the practice of the law in 1938 and is at present a member of the Euro of the States of New York and Arizona and also the Bar of the United States Supreme Court.

THEREPORE, LET IT RE RESCLVED TEXT the PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL heroby engages the longer and longer to perfore the following services:

- a. Adviso the PAPAGO TRIBAL COURCIL and the PAPAGO TRIBAL CHAIRMAN on all matters referred to him either by the TRIBAL COURCIL or the CHAIRMAN.
- b. Take such local action so the TRIBAL COUNCIL shall specifically direct; and

IET IT FURTHER ET HESOLVED THAT, within the limitations of the \$2,000 appropriated in the 1961 Tribal Budget for attorney's fees and expenses, the said attorney be campensated by the Papago Tribal Council as follows:

a. The said atterney shall be paid the sea of Ol2.50 per hour for each hour which it is necessary for his to spend in the performance of the duties assigned to him by the TRIBAL COURCIL or the TRIBAL CHARMAN pursuant to this resolution.

b. The said ettorney shall be reimbursed for all his actual and necessary expenses incurred in corrying out this contract; said reimbursement to be made upon presentation of detailed vouchers duly submitted by said attorney and approved by the Secretary of the Interior or his authorized representative; and

BS IT RESOLVED THAT the term of employment of the said attorney be for the flocal year of the Papago Tribe ending June 30; 1961; and

By IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the said attorney shall present to the Chairman of the Papago Tribal Council and to the sutherized representative of the Secretary of the Interior on a date to be specified in the attorney contract, and not less eften than quarterly thereafter, so long as this conta

LET IT FURTHER-BE RI COUNCIL be and they nevery are numbrized to execute the aforesaid contract for end on behalf of the PAPAGO TRIBS.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papero Tribal Council on August 12, 1960, with a vote of 18 for, and O against during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V; Section 2 (b) of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 16, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said Recolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and subject to the recoission by the Socretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
