

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

REG. NO. 1142

WHEREAS, On November 25, 1960, George A. Freeman, 201 East 4th Street, Casa Grande, Arizona, made an application for a silica permit on 40 acres in the NW^c of SE^c of Section 30, T. 93, R. 53, which is about one-half mile west of the Mamoli Well, and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Freeman wished to exchange this 40 acres for acres now held as part of the area under silica permit contract No. 14020-450-3326, and,

WHEREAS, The Sir Cicak District represented by its Chairman, Jose Hillman Ventura, and the Tribal Council, are not in favor of the proposed exchange or a separate permit, but believe it would be more advantageous to the Tribe and reasonable for Mr. Freeman if the 40 acres were added to the present permit No. 14020-450-3326, which provides for an advance royalty of \$1200, and,

WHEREAS, If such acreage is added to this permit, the Council also believes that Mr. Freeman should pay an advance annual royalty of \$200 more for the 40 acres, and the Council is willing that this amount be prorated for the period between the date modification of the permit is approved by the U. S. A.; and the anniversary date of the permit; so that at the time of the next anniversary date, a total of \$1400 will be due as advance royalty for the following year.

THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that it approve the application of George A. Freeman on the above basis, and that it request the Bureau of Indian Affairs to modify the above numbered contract to add the 40 acres applied for by Mr. Freeman, require payment of the additional advance royalty specified, and to require compliance with any other applicable government regulations.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on December 2, 1960, with a vote of 21 for, and 0 against, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (Stat. 924). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
