RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1342

WHEREAS, a well is badly needed in the Village of White Horse Pass in the Sif Oidak District, and the old well in the Village has dried up completely, and

WHEREAS, the water from this well was formerly used in farming developments near the Chuicha farm area, and the people of White Horse Pass are now forced to go to Chuicha, a distance of three miles, to get their water, and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of the Bureau of Indian Affairs at Sells has stated that he will set aside a certain amount of money from the Urban Renewal Program to assist in the construction of this proposed well, and

WHEREAS, the residents of White Horse Pass desire that this well be constructed as soon as possible, and the Sif Oidak District Council has requested the Papago Council to adopt and enact this Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT RESOLVED, that the Papago Council herein and hereby requests the U. S. Public Health Service to construct this said well at White Horse Pass as soon as possible, and further orders and directs that copies of this Resolution be forwarded to Dr. W. S. Baum, Medical Officer in Charge, Phoenix Area Office, Public Health Service, and to Dr. Lewis E. Patrie, Medical Officer in Charge, Sells Indian Hospital, urging these officials to assist in obtaining the construction of this said well at White Horse Pass.

The above Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on January 3, 1964, with a vote of 20 for, 0 against, and 1 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
