PESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1345

WEREAS. from time to time in the past, on Resolution of the Council, Mrs. Elizabeth Estrada, Tribal Director of Arts and Crafts, has received from the Tribe advances of money to be used for the purchase of Papago basists, and those basists are later sald at county fairs, rodecs, art feativals and similar escapions, and

WHEREAS, for the past three or four menths Mrs. Estrada has been buying bashets, nortly for sale at the Tubec Festival of Arte and Crafts, the Pima County July, the visit to Solle of the A.A.U. Women in March, and similar events, and has disbursed all of the money advanced to her by the Tribe, and

WEEREAS, these advances of money do not appear in the Papake Tribal Budget because the money is always replaced in the General Fund of the Tribe at the time the Tribel Directer accounts to the Tribe.

HOW, THEREFORE, LET IT HE RESOLVED, that the Papage Council hereby erders and directs that the sum of \$500.00 in cash be immediately advanced to hirs. Estrada for the purnose of purchasing basks to as above set forth-

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papage Council on January 3, 1964, with a vote of 19 for, 0 against, and 2 not voting, during a meeting at which a querum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (1), Section 3 (a) and Section 3 (b) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Payage Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on Jamery 6, 1937, (State 90k), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 193ks Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papage Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, purguent to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Lens of the Papago Tribe.
