PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1347

WHIREAS, the Papago Tribe on June 5, 1062 entered into a writer agreement with Edward B. Berger, Attorney at how, engaging 1 of services of Mr. Berger as Attorney for the Papago Tribe, sale agreement to remain in force and effect until June 30, 1963, and

WHEREAS, said retainer agreement provided that as compensation for the vervices under said agreement the Autorney would be entitled to be part by the Tribe the sum of \$15.00 per hour for each hour spent in the performance of his duties as Autorney, and

WHEREAS, said agreement further to iced that the total amount to be to the said Attorney as compensation for his services and as air and for approved expenses incurred a lim should not exceed the same in 2000 during the fiscal year, and

WHILE AS, the said Tribal Attorney has now requested of the Pribe which he may rate be increased from \$15.00 per hour to \$20.00 per hour that the maximum limitation of payment be increased from \$3,0.0.00 per \$5,000.00, and

WHERE , it has been pointed out by the said Tribal Attorney that the public of minimum fees of the Pima County Bar Association has been induced from \$25.00 to \$30.00 per hour for legal work performed, and

W.ETUAS, the quality of legal performed by the said Trical Attorns, merits a fair and equitable increase.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, the the Papago Council Triebe and approves an increase in the comparation of Edward A. It for the Attorney, for legal services rendered to the Tribe from \$15 or provided to \$20.00 per hour, and further grants and approves an increase from \$3,000.00 to \$5,000.00 in the total amount to be paid to the mid Tribal Attorney for compensation for his services and as reimpersonal for approximations approximately approximately approximately approximately approximately for compensation for his services and as reimpersonal for approximately for approximately for the form of t

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby orders and directs the Tribal Officials to enter into a written retainer agreement with the said Tribal Attorney, said agreement to remain in force and effect for a period of three years beginning January 1, 1964 and ending December 31, 1967. The contract may be terminated by either party by giving thirty days written notice by the other party, the Secretary of Interior or his authorized representative and the Area Director.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on January 3, 1964 with a vote of 19 for; 0 against, and 2 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (b) and Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 5 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
