

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO GOUNCIL

RES. NO. 1350

WHEREAS, the Papage Tribal Council on November 8,1963, passed Resolution No. 1338, calling attention to the crossed conditions existing at the Santa Rese Boarding School, and directing that the Associations then existing in the School be immediately brought to the attention of Mr. W. Wade Head, Area Director, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Phoenix Area Office, and of Mr. Thomas H. St. Clair, Superintendent, Papago Indian Agency, and

WHREAS, copies of the said Resolution No. 1338 were fermanded to both of these officials of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and both officials were requested to take immediate steps to remody this situation and to provide sufficient classrooms and teachers to take care adequately of the needs of the students and teachers at the said Santa Rosa Bay School, and

WHEREAS, conditions have remained unchanged since the date of the said Resolution and the physical plant as it exists is inadequate to meet minimum standards and does not provide sufficient classrooms for the number of pupils attending and classes are now being held in the deputteries of the School, and

WHEREAS, because of the seements situation in which Papago people are unable to find employment off the Reservation, many of the people are returning to the Reservation, resulting in an ever increasing number of children attending the school, and

WHEELS, although officials of the Papage Indian Agency of the Bureau of Indian Affairs have requested funds for the construction of a new school plant for the Santa Ross Boarding School, to date no notice has been received that there is a building project scheduled for either 1964 or 1965, and

WHRMAS, existing conditions at the School are most serious incomes as they affect the education of young Papago students and education is a most important factor on the Papago Reservation.

NOW, TERRUCER, LET IT BE RESCLVED, that the Papage Tribal Geometh having called attention to the conditions at the Santa Rose Recogning School, howevery urges and implores Mr. W. Wade Head, Area Director, to use every and all means at his command to secure the funds necessary to construct immediately adequate facilities to meet the needs for the present and projected enrollment at the School.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESCLYED, that the Papago Gouncil orders and directs that a copy of this Resolution be immediately forwarded to Hr. Head and that Hr. Head be strongly urged to contact all and necessary officials in the Federal Government to bring an immediate termination to the deplorable and wretched conditions now existing in the Santa Resa School.

The above Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on March 6, 1964, with a vote of 18 for and 0 against, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (a), Section 2 (d), Section 2 (h) and Section 2 (k) of Artiple V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 954), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
