**RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL**

RES. NO. 1352

WHEREAS, J. L. Harcer of Tucson, Arizona, has applied to the Tribe for a lease on the Tribal buildings at Fresno Canyon for a period of 5 years, and

WHEREAS, the buildings mentioned consist of two (2) stone buildings and a garage located on 1.74 acres of land and the applicant has agreed to lease the buildings at \$25.00 per month and \$75.00 per acre per year on the land for a total of \$450.00 per year and will furnish a surety bond for \$500.00 and carry fire insurance in the amount of \$4,000.00 on the buildings, and

WHEREAS one of the buildings is in poor condition and will need repair work to make it habitable and it is believed some arrangement can be worked out whereby the lessee will be given credit in rent for any repair work done to the buildings, and

WHEREAS, the Babequivari District Council has adopted a Resolution, accepting and approving the terms of this proposed lease.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Tribal Council hereby accepts and approves a lease from the said J. L. Harcer on the Tribal buildings at Fresno Canyon for a period of 5 years, consisting of two (2) stone buildings and a garage located on 1.74 acres of land, the rental of the buildings to be \$25.00 per month and \$75.00 per acre per year on the land for a total of \$450.00 per year with a surety bond of \$500.00 and fire insurance in the amount of \$4,000.00 on the buildings, the bond and fire insurance to be furnished by the lessee, and

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Tribal Chairman be, and he hereby is authorized and empowered to enter into an agreement with the lessee whereby the lessee may be given credit in rent for any repair work done by the lessee on the buildings.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on April 3, 1964, with a vote of 20 for, 0 against, and 1 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (a) and Section 3 (b) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 904), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
