

**RESOLUTION  
OF THE  
FAPAGO COUNCIL.**

**RES. NO. 139**

**WHEREAS, the Tribal building in Sells, currently occupied by the U. S. Post Office, Department, is now vacant and in poor condition, and**

**WHEREAS, the walls of the building have sprung out in several places and substantial beams trapped in the walls and these latter beams inside the building, and**

**WHEREAS, inspection of the building was recently made by officials of the Fapago Indian Agency and their report to the Tribe was that it would be highly dangerous for anyone to occupy the building and that repairs to the building would not be feasible, and**

**WHEREAS, physical inspection of the building has been made by one or more members of the Tribal Council and their examination has borne out the conditions reported by the Agency officials, and**

**WHEREAS, the Fapago Tribe would be held legally responsible in the event that the collapse of the building, either in whole or in part, should injure or cause the death of any person or persons.**

**NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Fapago Council hereby orders and directs that the said Tribal building, currently occupied by the Postoffice Department, be immediately vacated and demolished and that the Tribal Chairman be authorized to obtain the necessary aid and assistance in order to bring about this demolition.**

The above Resolution was duly enacted by the Fapago Council on April 3, 1966, with a vote of 17 Aye, 0 against, and 0 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (E) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Fapago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1954, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1957, (Stat. 99), pursuant to Section 14 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
