**RESOLUTION  
OF THE  
PAPAGO COUNCIL**

RES. NO. 1357

WHEREAS, from some time there has been an unused balance of \$1,822.00 in the Bull Bond Account of the Tribal Herd Ranch, a Papago Tribal enterprise and this balance will not be required to pay off all the bull rental deposits now on file with the Tribal Herd Ranch, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Herd has recently purchased a 1964 model Chevrolet 2-ton Truck to be used in transporting bulls to and from the Tribal Herd Ranch, and

WHEREAS, there is no advantage to be gained in purchasing the said Truck on credit or time payments as long as the Tribal Herd Ranch Account has sufficient cash with which to pay for the Truck inasmuch as the financing costs and interest payments would be costly.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby orders and directs that the Tribal Herd Ranch Budget for the current fiscal year be, and the same hereby is amended to enable the transfer of the said unused balance of \$1,822.00 in the Tribal Herd Account to be applied on the purchase price of the said Chevrolet 2-ton Truck.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the balance of the purchase price of the said Truck, after said transfer of funds, be paid from the Tribal Herd Surplus Fund, and that the remainder of the Tribal Herd Budget for the current fiscal year shall remain in full force and effect.

The above Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on May 1, 1964, with a vote of 21 for, 0 against, and 1 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
