

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1359

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has recently been brought as a party defendant into an action commenced some time ago by the Papago Farms (tenant) as plaintiff, against Thomas H. St. Clair, as defendant, said action arising out of cancellation of a certain lease in 1961 covering property known as Papago Farms (property) on the Papago Reservation, and

WHEREAS, Edward B. Berger of Tucson, Arizona, an attorney at law duly admitted to practice in the State of Arizona, is now Tribal Attorney for the Papago Tribe and has charge of all legal and litigated matters on behalf of the Tribe, and


WHEREAS, an answer to the action must now be filed on behalf of the Papago Tribe and the Tribe must be fully and adequately represented at all stages of the said action.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Council, on behalf of the Papago Tribe, hereby authorizes and empowers the said attorney at law, Edward B. Berger, of Tucson, Arizona, to appear in the said case as attorney and counsel for the Papago Tribe, and to represent the Tribe as attorney in all stages of the action until the termination of such action, unless otherwise ordered and directed by the Papago Council.

The above Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on May 1, 1964, with a vote of 22 for and 0 against, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
