

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1369

WHEREAS, Maricopa County has applied to the Tribe for a road right of way 80 feet wide and 3,553.76 feet long through the east tract of land on the Gila Bend Reservation deeded to the Papago Tribe, and

WHEREAS, this application means that a well maintained road will be available to residents of Sil Murk Village to the town of Gila Bend, and

WHEREAS, a structure should be built at the western end of the road within the east tract where irrigation tail water often washes out part of the roadbed where it crosses a wash, and

WHEREAS, the Gila Bend District Council has passed a Resolution, approving said right of way, provided the above-mentioned structure is built.


NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Tribal Council herein and hereby grants to the said Maricopa County a road right of way 80 feet wide and 3,553.76 feet long through the east tract of land on the Gila Bend Reservation, which land was previously deeded to the Papago Tribe, said right of way to be used for the construction of a road which will run between Sil Murk Village on the Reservation and the town of Gila Bend, Arizona.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that said right of way is hereby granted with the distinct understanding and provision that a structure be built at the western end of the road within the east tract where irrigation tail water often washes out part of the roadbed at a where the roadbed crosses a wash.

The above Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on July 10, 1964, with a vote of 17 for, against, and 3 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (a) and Section 3 (b) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act. of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
