RESCRIPTION OF THE PAPAGO COMMUNIAL

PPS. NO. 1371

VHEREAS, the annual scoting of the Sational Congress of Asseriess Indians will be held this year in Shoridan, typning on July 27th through July 3lot, and

VHIREAS, it has been the couten for some time for the Papage Tribe to send the Tribel Chairman and other members of the Tribe to the Mosting as delegates and alternates of the Tribe, and

MEREAS, it is to the benefit of the Papage Tribe to have delegates and alternates at this important Meeting to represent the Tribe and to gain information relative to the problems and the administration of business by American Indians throughout the nation, and

WHEREAS, this year's Meeting will be doubly important on eccount of President Lyndon Johnson's Max on Poverty and the import it will have on the living standards of the American Indian, and this subject will undoubtedly be discussed at length in the Convention.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESCLVED, that the Papage Tribal Council hereby makes and appoints Tribal Chairman Eugene J. Johnson as efficial delegate of the Papage Tribe to attend the 1964 annual Meeting of the National Congress of American Indians.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESCLUED, that the Tribal Chairman is authorized and empowered to select a member of the Papago Tribe to assumpany the Chairman to the annual Meeting, and that the person so selected shall be the official alternate of the Papago Tribe.

LET IT BE STILL FURTHER RESGLVED, that the Tribal Treasurer is hereby authorized and esponered to pay to the said official delegate and to the said official alterante of the Tribe their necessary and proper esponess is attending the Meeting and that the proper vouchers for such expenditures shall be propared and issued.

The feregoing Resolution was duly enseted by the Papago Council on July 10, 1964, with a vote of 17 fer, 0 against, and 3 set voting, during a secting at which a query was present, pursuant to authority vosted in the Council by Section 2 (1) and Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and Ry-Laus of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act. of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is offective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to restigation by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of article V of the Constitution and Byslaus of the Papago Tribe.
