

RESOLUTION  
OF THE  
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1371

WHEREAS, the annual meeting of the National Congress of American Indians will be held this year in Sheridan, Wyoming on July 27th through July 31st, and

WHEREAS, it has been the custom for some time for the Papago Tribe to send the Tribal Chairman and other members of the Tribe to the Meeting as delegates and alternates of the Tribe, and

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the Papago Tribe to have delegates and alternates at this important Meeting to represent the Tribe and to gain information relative to the problems and the administration of business by American Indians throughout the nation, and

WHEREAS, this year's Meeting will be doubly important on account of President Lyndon Johnson's War on Poverty and the impact it will have on the living standards of the American Indian, and this subject will undoubtedly be discussed at length in the Convention.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Tribal Council hereby names and appoints Tribal Chairman Eugene J. Johnson as official delegate of the Papago Tribe to attend the 1964 annual Meeting of the National Congress of American Indians.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Tribal Chairman is authorized and empowered to select a member of the Papago Tribe to accompany the Chairman to the annual Meeting, and that the person so selected shall be the official alternate of the Papago Tribe.

LET IT BE STILL FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Tribal Treasurer is hereby authorized and empowered to pay to the said official delegate and to the said official alternate of the Tribe their necessary and proper expenses in attending the Meeting and that the proper vouchers for such expenditures shall be prepared and issued.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on July 16, 1964, with a vote of 17 for, 0 against, and 3 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (f) and Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
