WHEREAS, the Senate and the House of Sepresentatives of the Smited States did on August 8, 1964 enect the "Escandis Opportunity Act of 1964", thereby stating it to be the policy of the United States" to climinate the paradex of poverty in the midst of plenty in this Mation by opening to everyone the opportunity for education and training the opportunity to work, and the apportunity to live in decency and dignity", and

MERCHAS, The Papago Gaussil did on September 2, 19th receive official motification that the Papago Tribe had been selected as one of thirteen tribes in the United States to be permitted to prepare a program of assistance, under the provisions of the Reenante Opportunity Act of 19th, and submit said program to the Office of the Director of the Office of Reenante Opportunity for his consideration, and

WHEREAS, The Papage Council, after due consideration, did on September 5, 19th appoint a Papage Community Action Countities and instructed it to begin immediately the work of formulating a Papage Community Action Program for submission to the Office of the Director of the Office of Secondic Opportunity, and

WHEREAS, the Community Action Committee has held numerous and long meetings with the people in the districts involving many kears of discussion and deliberations, at which time the people made their suggmentions and proposals for action programs in their communities, and

WHERAS, the Community Action Committee has presented to the Paparo Council The Paparo Community Action Program that was drafted under the previsions of the Responts Opportunity Act of 1966, and more particularly under the previsions of 71tle II of the said Act, forite consideration,

THEREFORE, HE IT PRECEIVED by the Papago Commeil that the Papago Community Action Program he approved and, that it be forwarded immediately to the Office of the Director of the Office of Recommic Opportunity for his consideration.

The foregoing resolution was on September 25, 1964, duly exacted by a vote of 16 for and 0 against, by the Sapage Council parament to authority vested in it by Section 2 (a), (e), and (f) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on Recember 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Sec. 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (AS Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papage Agency, and a net subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
