PAPAGO COUNCIL without action

WHEREAS, Trico Electric Co-operative, Inc. of Tucson has applied to the Papago Council for a power line right-of-way to serve electricity to the Villages of Vaya Chin and Gu Vo on the Papago Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the first proposed line is to extend from San Simon to Vaya Chin and the second proposed line is to extend from Pisinimo to Gu Vo, the Vaya Chin line starting in Pisinimo District, passing through Gu Achi District, and ending in Hickiwan District, and the Gu Vo line commencing in Pisinime District and ending in Gu Vo District, and

WHEREAS, these two power lines will be constructed at the request of the two Papago villages which will receive the electric power and the Papago Indian agency has recommended to the Papago Council that the right-of-way be granted without charge, and

WHEREAS, the service of electricity to the two Villages concerned will be of great benefit to the Papago consumers residing in the area of these two Villages.

MOW, THER FORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Council herein and hereby grants to the said Trico Electric Co-operative, Inc. a power line right effect way for two power lines, the first line to extend from the Village of San Simon to the Village of Vaya Chin, commencing in the Pisinimo District, passing through the Gu Achi District, and ending in the Hickiwan District, and the second line extending from the village of Pisinimo to the Village of Gu Ve, commencing in the pisinimo District and ending in the Gu Vo District, said right-of-way to be granted without charge.

The above Resolution was duly enacted by the Lapago Council on October 9, 1964, with a vote of 16 for, O against, and 2 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authoraty vested in the Council by Section 2 (a) and section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (Stat. 984) pursuant to section 16 of the act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior. Pursuant to section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
