RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res. No. 1393

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has a pending land claims case before the Indian Land Claims Commission, and

WHEREAS, the Papago Council passed Resolution No. 1355 amending the contract between the Papago Tribe and Royal B. Marks, Tribal Land Claims Attorney, to provide that the contract be increased from \$10,000.00 to \$15,000.00, and that of this amount \$5,000.00 is to be paid to Dr. Bernard L. Fontana for his services as an expert witness (anthropologist) in presentation of the Tribal land claims case in Washington, D. C., and

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has no funds with which to pay its present obligations in connection with the land claims case nor will said Tribe have sufficient funds to hire expert witnesses for the prosecution of said land claims case, and

WHEREAS, under Act of Congress (77 Stat. 301) it is possible for the Tribe to make application for a loan from the United States to procure funds for expert witnesses, and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Attorney and General Council, Edward B. Berger, is assisting in the preparation of the documents necessary to obtain said funds, and

WHEREAS, it will be necessary to have the sum of \$30,000.00 to pay for said expert assistance,

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby authorized the Tribal Chairman, Eugene Johnson, General Council, Edward B. Berger, and Tribal Land Claims Attorney, Royal B. Marks, to make application to, and prepare all necessary documents for the application, to the Department of the Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs, for a loan as provided in Act 77 Stat. 301, in the amount of \$30,000.00 for the purposes of procuring and paying expert assistance in the preparation of the Tribal land claims case.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Toiyabe Council on the 6th day of November, 1964, by a vote of 20 for, 0 against, and _____ not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Toiyabe Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 22, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Act. 904), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act. of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Toiyabe Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Toiyabe Tribe.
