

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

Res. No. 1437

WHEREAS, since 1961 the United States Army at Fort Huachuca leased Waterman Hill in Tohuk Toak District and since then the United States Army failed to pay the monthly rental, and

WHEREAS, there is now a rental of \$400 due to the Papago Tribe and the Tohuk Toak District.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that the rental due to the Papago Council and the Tohuk Toak District be brought to the attention of the Adjacent General of the United States Army at Fort Huachuca.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on January 7, 1966, with a vote of 20 for, 0 against, and 2 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 986), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
