WHERBAS, Chapter 1, Section 2, of the Papago Tribal Law and Order Code provides for the appointment of an Associate Judge for Sells and the Papago Reservation, and

WHEREAS, Joe Reino, a member of the Papago Tribe, residing in the Village of San Miguel on the Papago Reservation, and

WIEREAS; The Papage Tribal Council has duly and thoroughly considered the matter of this appointment.

NOW, THERBRORS, LET IT EE RESOLVED, by the Papago Tribal Council that it recommends to the Eureau of Indian Affairs that Joe Reino be appointed Associate Judge of the Papago Tribal Court, to serve on such occasion or occasioons when his services as Associate Judge are required, at a salary of \$10.00 per day or fraction of a day, whenever he so serves as said Associate Judge, said appointment to be effective for a period of two years, and to be paid from Tribal Funds budgeted for the Associate Judge.

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Tribal Council on April 1, 1966, with a vote of 16 for, 0 against and 3 not voting, at a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (a), Section 3 (b), and Section 3 (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stab. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. a Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago, Agency and is subjectito rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution any By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
