

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1447

WHEREAS, There was a Loan Board established by the Tribe in April of 1938 and terminated on June 30, 1954, and

WHEREAS, At December 1, 1959, 313 individual ledgers showed a total of \$25,071.44 outstanding. There was no accrued interest due to cancellation by Resolution 769, November 12, 1954, and

WHEREAS, The Papago Tribal Council wishes to collect the outstanding loans without the accrued interest to date and the money to be deposited in the Education Committee Fund for scholarship to Papago students in need of money for school, and

WHEREAS, Many of the Papagos that owe the Tribe have deceased and the Council feels at this time not to try to collect this part from the relatives and only to collect from people that are still living.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Papago Officials may take the necessary steps to recover the outstanding loans and that all interest accrued to date be cancelled and forgiven for ever.

The foregoing resolution was, on April 1, 1966 duly enacted by a vote of 16 for, 0 against and 1 not voting by the Papago Tribal Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a) Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Section 6 Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
