RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. 1449

WHEREAS, Gu. Achi District Council and the Papago Tribal Council have approved a new site for Santa Rosa Boarding School to be located immediately south of Sif Oidak District southern boundry line and west of Bureau of Indian Affairs Road, Route No. 15, and

WHEREAS, A diversion ditch right-of-way, fifty feet wide, extending from the district fence line to Anegam Wash will be required for the new school, the right-of-way being described as follows:

Commencing at a point located in the center of south edge of cattle-guard along district boundry line on Route 15, thence N86° 50'W along fence line for a distance of 3,395.92 feet to a point which is the beginning of the center-line for the right-of-way, thence N18°31'E for a distance of 387.0 feet to Anegam Wash, said right of way being 25 feet wide on each side of center line and containing 0.44 acre;

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby grants the right-of-way as described above.

The above resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on April 1, 1966, with a vote of 18 for, 0 against and 1 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3(h) of Article V of the constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
