RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1450

WHEREAS, Matilda Juan resigned from her position of Court Clerk in the Tribal Law and Order Department, and

WHEREAS, Nellie Pablo of Vamori Village has applied for the position of Court Clerk, has been interviewed by the Vice-Chairman, and has been appointed to the position by the Tribal Council Chairman, subject to confirmation of the appointment by the Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, it appears that Mrs. Pablo is qualified to fill the position, having graduated from the Phoenix Indian School and having then attended Haskell Institute in Lawrence, Kansas as a Commercial student for one year and has once before worked for the Law and Order Department with satisfactory work.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby confirms the appointment by the Tribal Chairman of Mrs. Nellie Pablo as Court Clerk in the Tribal Law and Order Department, said appointment to be effective as of March 28, 1966.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on April 1, 1966, with a vote of 17 for, 0 against, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2(e) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
