RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL OFFICE

Res.-No. 1463

WHEREAS, the Corps of Engineers, Washington D.C. proposed to Sif Oidak District Council a test range to be established by the Army Map Service in the Vicinity of Casa Grande, Arizona which includes part of the Papago Indian Reservation in the Chuichu Area, and

WHEREAS, the Sif Oidak District Council and Corps of Engineers agreed upon the following described land;

Parcels being located in portions of T-7-S, R-5-E; T-8-S, R-5-E and R-6-E; and T-9-S, G&SR&M, Pinal County, Arizona.

And,

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council along with Sif Oidak District Council grant to the Corps of Engineers the Right-of-entry subject to the following conditions:

1. The Government may enter upon the above described parcels in order to examine and survey them for the purpose of locating suitable sites for the establishment of aerial photographic panel markers.
2. The Government may enter upon the above-described parcels in order to establish and construct not more than one aerial photographic panel marker site within each section of the above-described parcels. Each site established shall not be more than 100 feet square.
3. The government shall be permitted ingress and egress across the Papago Indian Reservation for the purpose of operating under this permit or right-of-entry.
4. It is understood and agreed that if the Government does not acquire a necessary interest in said sites prior to the expiration of this permit or right-of-entry, or any renewal thereof, the government agrees to be responsible for any damage arising from the activity of the government or its agents on the above described parcels, in the exercise of rights under this permit or right-of-entry, and shall repair such damages, or, in lieu thereof and at the option of the Government, shall make a cash settlement with the Papago Tribe of Arizona.

- 5. All tools, equipment, improvements, and other property taken or placed upon the above described parcels by the Government shall remain the property of the Government and may be removed by the Government at any time within a period of sixty days after the expiration of this permit or right-of-entry.
- 6. This permit or right-of-entry shall expire nine (9) months from the date of execution hereof.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that it approve the permit of right-of-entry to the Corps of Engineers in accordance with the agreement described above.

The foregoing Resolution was on June 3, 1966, duly enacted by a vote of 18 for and 0 against by the Papago Council pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. (Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
